

EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE AND CERTIFICATION

ABOUT

Federal Regulations. Federal regulations require the University to publicly disclose whether completion of University programs that lead or may lead to professional licensure or certification would meet a given state's educational requirements for a specific professional license or certification required for employment in an occupation (regardless of whether the program is on-ground, online, or hybrid).

Table of Professional Licensure and Certification Information. In the table below, MSU discloses information related to the educational requirements for professional licensure and certification. Information is organized by college, then within each college, by department. Column (1) indicates the program name (or the course name, for online and hybrid programs only), as well as the award conferred or recommended by MSU upon completion of the program or course (if applicable); <u>online and hybrid programs are denoted with a single asterisk</u>.*

For the programs/courses listed in column (1), columns (3)-(5) indicate whether or not completion of the course/program would meet the educational requirements for professional licensure/certification indicated in column (2), in each case for the states listed in the respective columns. For these purposes, "state" includes the 50 States of the Union, the District of Columbia, as well as American Samoa, Guam, Marshall Islands, Micronesia, Northern Mariana Islands, Palau, Puerto Rico, and U.S. Virgin Islands.

- The table includes current contact information for the applicable licensure/certification board in each state where MSU was unable to determine whether completion of an online or hybrid program would meet the educational requirements for professional licensure/certification. In such cases, current and prospective students are advised to determine whether the program meets the requirements in the states where they are located.
- <u>All current and prospective students</u> are encouraged to contact the applicable licensure/certification boards in their respective states for additional information regarding professional licensure and certification requirements, including, without limitation, information regarding any <u>non</u>-educational requirements (such as work experience, background clearance, or examination by outside entities, such as bar examinations).
- The information below should not be construed as guaranteeing that any particular professional licensure/certification authority will approve a student's application; nor should the information below be read to imply that other requirements for professional licensure/certification do not exist or that other requirements for professional licensure/certification have been determined to have been met by MSU's program/course, or that any necessary approvals for clinical or other experiential learning placements are secured by virtue of a student's enrollment at MSU.
- State professional licensure/certification requirements are subject to change at any time.

PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE COMPACTS AND RECIPROCITY

- Bar Reciprocity. Some states have reciprocity agreements with other states, which allow attorneys who are licensed in those states to be admitted to the bar without having to take the exam or complete additional CLE requirements. This is often contingent on the lawyer having practiced law for a minimum amount of time. The state may also require a degree from an ABA accredited law school. - Interstate Medical Licensure Compact (IMLC) gives physicians who meet the eligibility requirements the ability to practice medicine across state lines within the Compact. Physicians will apply through the IMLC to determine if they are eligible, once qualified they will have the capability to apply to each IMLC participating state in an expedited way. - Nursing License Compact (NLC). Compact nursing states refer to the Nursing Licensure Compact (NLC), which is an agreement between states that allows nurses to have one compact state nursing license that gives them the ability to practice in other states that are part of the agreement. Nurses that hold a multistate license can practice in other NLC states/territories without obtaining additional licenses, while their primary state of residence (PSOR) is in a compact state including telehealth care to patients located in other NLC states/territories. - Social Work Licensure Compact. Not yet enacted. The Council of State Governments (CSG) is partnering with the Department of Defense (DoD) and the Association of Social Work Boards (ASWB) to support the mobility of licensed social workers through the development of a new interstate compact. - Teaching Certification Reciprocity outlines which qualification each state will accept from another state and which qualification it will not. However, interstate reciprocity is not automatic. Teachers must apply for a new license if they are looking to teach in a state where they are not currently licensed, and the state teacher licensing agency reviews teaching certificate reciprocity on a case-by-case basis. States that anticipate in teaching certification reciprocity agreements usually allow educators who move from one state to another additional time to fulfill the new state's requirements while teaching on a temporary or provisional license basis. Students are encouraged to visit the Educational Commission of the States website that provides information regarding reciprocity along with other pertinent information for each respective state.

Alabama - State authorization to provide a program related to the preparation of teachers or other P-12 school/system personnel does not indicate eligibility for an Alabama certificate. Applicants for an <u>Alabama certificate based on reciprocity</u> must meet Alabama's test requirements and submit a valid, renewable professional educator certificate/icense issued by another state at the degree level, grade level, and in the teaching field or are of instructional support for which an Alabama certificate is sought and for which Alabama issues a certificate. Applicants for <u>Alabama certificate based on reciprocity</u> must meet Alabama's test requirements and submit a valid, renewable professional educator administration in an area of administration must also document at least three years of full-time employment as an administration of systems(). Alaska – The Alaska Department of Education and Early Development has <u>state history course requirements</u> that can be completed after initial licensure. A one-year, nonrenewable, provisional license is given to those who have met the degree/internship requirement but have not completed a history course/workshop. For additional information regarding certification requirements and regulations, visit the Alaska Department of Education and Early Development website.

Arkansas – The Arkansas Division of Elementary and Secondary Education has state history course requirements that consist of at least three (3) college credit hours in Arkansas history at an accredited institution of higher education. A one-year, nonrenewable, provisional license is given to those who have met the degree/internship requirement but have not completed a history course/workshoo. For additional information rearding licensure requirements and regulations, visit the Arkansas Division of Elementary and Secondary Education website.

California – The California Commission on Teacher Credentialing regulations require a comparable teaching credential earned in a state or U.S. Territory other than California based upon completion of a professional preparation program (or alternative program) in secondary education, including student teaching, taken at a regionallyaccredited institution. The credential does not have to be valid at the time of apolication.

Massachusetts – The Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education requires endorsements in Sheltered English Immersion, Transition Specialist, Bilingual Education, and a voluntary endorsement in Autism. Nebraska – The Nebraska Department of Education requires Human Relations Training and Special Education Training for anyone who holds an educator certificate or permit in Nebraska. South Dakota – South Dakota (Codified Law 13-1-48) requires any teacher new to the profession, from out-of-state, or certified after 1993 shall complete a three (3) credit hour course in <u>South Dakota Indian Studies</u>. Texas - Without a standard teaching certificate, applicants are not eligible for a review of credentials and the Texas Education Agency does not review transcripts, degree level or completion of program coursework, even if the applicant has already sat for exams. Individuals without a standard teaching certificate must either complete the process in their state or would be required to go through a Texas Educator Preparation Program.

<u>Virginia</u> - The Virginia Board of Education requires those seeking initial licensure to complete the following: Training in <u>cultural competency</u>; completion of certification or training in emergency first aid; cardiopulmonary resuscitation; and use of automated external defibrillators. Study in attention deficit disorder, gifted education, methods of improving communication between schools and families, study in child abuse recognition and intervention. Any teacher responsible for teaching the state-developed <u>African American History</u> elective course must have either a history and social (2700) endorsement. Persons with an <u>endorsement as a school counselor</u> shall complete mandatory <u>Vyslexia Training</u> awareness training on indicators of dyslexia and recognition of mental health disorial discress or additional information regarding other requirements and licensure regularized to the <u>Virginia Department of Education</u>, website.
